

Stilling with Trees

Find a tree in the garden. Sit or stand in its shade or find somewhere comfortable that you can look at it. Spend a bit of time really looking at the tree think about the shape, colours and the details. Use all your senses to help you be present in the moment. Touch the bark or look at the detail in a leaf. Breathe in the scent of the woodland.

Now choose one of the verses below. Fold the paper over so you are not distracted by the other verses. Read it slowly a few times. What words stand out for you? If you find yourself becoming distracted simply notice and bring your attention gently back to the verse or the tree. Ask God to show you what he might want to say to you through this time and this verse. Spend time in quiet thinking about it. Use your verse and experience to give thanks.
